October 23 and 24 council 4715 had a Holy Hour for protection of the unborn. Deacon Thomas Magnuson

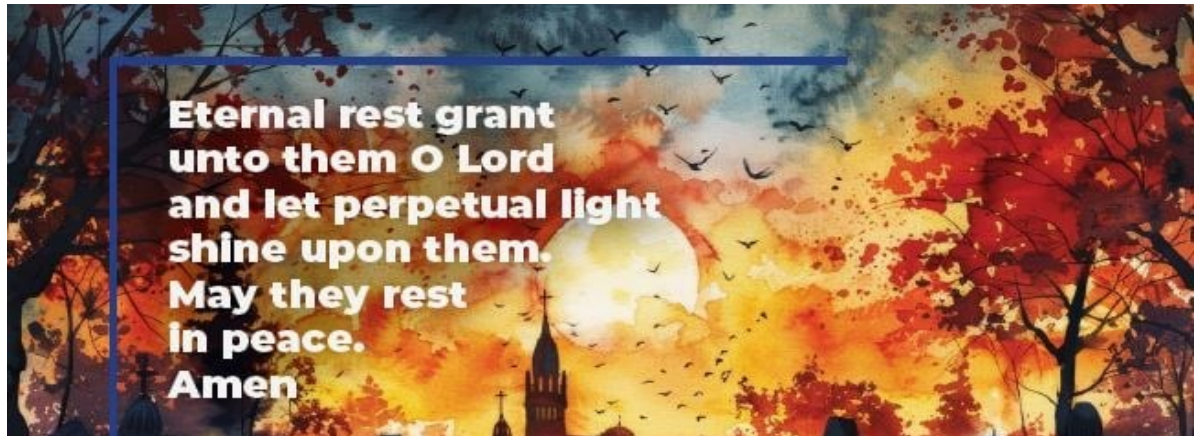
